• ANTIOCH WAS A VERY METROPOLITAN CITY AND ETHNICALLY DIVERSE.

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• WHEN PETER FIRST ARRIVED IN ANTIOCH, HE FREELY ATE WITH GENTILES. A BIG DEAL!

RECON

AND THERE CAME A VOICE TO HIM: "RISE, PETER; KILL AND EAT." BUT PETER SAID, "BY NO MEANS, LORD; FOR I HAVE NEVER EATEN ANYTHING THAT IS COMMON OR UNCLEAN." AND THE VOICE CAME TO HIM AGAIN A SECOND TIME, "WHAT GOD HAS MADE CLEAN, DO NOT CALL COMMON." ACTS 10:13-15 TRULY I UNDERSTAND THAT GOD SHOWS NO PARTIALITY, BUT IN EVERY NATION ANYONE WHO FEARS HIM AND DOES WHAT IS RIGHT IS ACCEPTABLE TO HIM. ACTS 10:34-35

- EATING A MEAL TOGETHER WAS A SIGN OF FRIENDSHIP AND ACCEPTANCE.

• PETER EXPERIENCED THE FREEDOM OF THE GOSPEL, EMPOWERING HIM TO CROSS ETHNIC AND RELIGIOUS BARRIERS.

- CIRCUMCISION PARTY: JEWS WHO TAUGHT THAT UNCIRCUMCISED AND "UNKOSHER" GENTILES COULD NOT BE CHRISTIANS.

• PETER WAS GUILTY OF HYPOCRISY.

- WARNING: HYPOCRISY IS ALWAYS INFECTIOUS.

• PETER'S HYPOCRISY WAS ROOTED IN FEAR.



- PETER'S HYPOCRISY WAS ROOTED IN FEAR.
- WHEN OUR FEAR OF PEOPLE IS GREATER THAN OUR FEAR OF GOD, OUR CONDUCT WILL BE OUT OF STEP WITH THE GOSPEL.

- FEAR CAN DESTROY THE BEAUTIFUL DIVERSITY AND RACIAL HARMONY IN A CHURCH.
- BECAUSE OF HIS FEARS, PETER INSISTED THAT GENTILE BELIEVERS ADOPT CULTURALLY FOREIGN CUSTOMS AND LIVE LIKE JEWS.

• WE DO THIS BY GETTING OTHERS TO EMBRACE OUR CUSTOMS IN ORDER FOR THEM TO FEEL ACCEPTED.

- IMPLICATION OF GOSPEL: WE ALL STAND EQUAL BEFORE GOD, REGARDLESS OF RACIAL BACKGROUND.

- IT TAKES HUMILITY TO LISTEN TO SOMEONE ELSE'S STORY AND PERCEPTIONS WITHOUT JUDGING, DEFENDING, OR WRITING THEM OFF.
