Pride in the religious sense is the arrogant refusal to let God be God. It is to grab God's status for one's self. In the vivid language of the Bible, pride is puffing yourself up in God's face. Pride is turning down God's invitation to join the dance of life as a creature in his garden and wishing instead to be the Creator, Independent, reliant on one's own resources. Never does pride want to pray for strength, ask for grace, plead for mercy, or give thanks to God...

...Once we decide we have to make it on our own, we are attacked by the demons of fear and anxiety. We suspect that we lack the power to become what our pride makes us think we are. So we learn to swagger, to bluff, to use symbols to cover up our fears that we lack substance. 
Before destruction a man's heart is haughty, but humility comes before honor. Proverbs 18:12

Philippians 2:5-8


WISDOM
